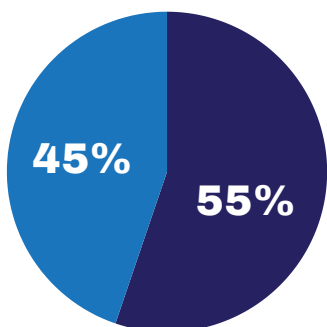


# SBHI BEHAVIORAL HEALTH INTEGRATION RESULTS

### Takeaway Points

1

Respondents expressed that integrated care is a high priority for their sites to provide higher quality patient care and ease staff workloads.

2

Respondents cited location space, ability to hire (and retain staff), insufficient reimbursement rates, and limited evidence-based research as barriers to implementing integrated behavioral health.

Continued education for primary care clinicians on the primary care behavioral health integration model, streamlined access to referral services (e.g., Regional Center), and improved EMR communication could boost integration levels.
